

Maggie Guillebaud Joins Sarum College Chaplaincy

The Revd Maggie Guillebaud was licensed as Associate Chaplain of Sarum College on 5 October by the Rt Revd Stephen Conway, acting Bishop of Salisbury.

“I’m delighted to join Sarum during this exciting stage of the college’s growth to offer pastoral support alongside Sr Mairead Quigley and to further develop its role in ecumenism and in the arts,” says Guillebaud, who previously was curate and associate priest at Salisbury Cathedral. She chaired the Southwest Arts Council from 1991 to 1997 and subsequently served as a member of the Arts Council of England.

The college is launching two new ecumenical MA programmes, in Theology, Imagination and the Arts and in Faith-based Leadership, in addition to its MA in Christian Liturgy, and the MA in Christian Spirituality, which has been running since 1999. Alongside these postgraduate study programmes, the college offers a range of non-accredited courses in fields of theology, liturgy, arts, leadership and in spirituality.

“As the College moves into its next phase of development, Maggie’s breadth of experience will be invaluable in fostering Sarum’s international ecumenical ties and links between art and theology,” said Canon Keith Lamdin, Sarum College principal.
