BOOKING FORM

Booking opens Tuesday 22nd April 2014

The Salisbury Playhouse Box Office has kindly undertaken to handle all bookings for the Festival.

Admission to most events will be by ticket. Please note that the number of tickets available for some events is limited by the capacity of the venue. Whenever possible we will try to offer an alternative if all available tickets for an event have been allocated at the time of booking. Early booking is advisable.

HOW TO BOOK

The Box Office in the Salisbury Playhouse foyer is open from Monday to Saturday. The office opens at 10 am and closes at 8 pm on days when there is a performance in the theatre, otherwise at 6 pm (phone lines at 5.30 pm). The telephone number is **01722 320333**.

Card Payments by Mastercard, Visa, Maestro and Delta are accepted.

Postal Bookings should be made using this form. Applications received by post before April 22nd will be processed in order of receipt, but no tickets will be issued before that date. Postal bookings must be accompanied either by a cheque or by card details. We regret that we cannot accept cash by post.

GETTING TO THE FESTIVAL

By Road. The drive from London takes about two hours; from Portsmouth, Southampton and Bournemouth less than an hour; from Bristol about an hour and a half. From the West Country and the Midlands, the drive takes about two hours. There is a useful local map online at [www.visitwiltshire.co.uk/dbimgs/Salisbury Map.pdf](http://www.visitwiltshire.co.uk/dbimgs/Salisbury%20Map.pdf), showing the principal road routes into Salisbury and the location of the Park & Ride sites and the main car parks.

By Rail. Trains run at least every hour between London Waterloo and Salisbury, and between Bristol or Exeter and Salisbury (less frequently on Sundays). The journey time in all cases is about 90 minutes. This service is operated by South West Trains, and a full current timetable can be found online at www.southwesttrains.co.uk/uploads/pocket20.pdf. In addition, First Great Western operates frequent services between Cardiff and Portsmouth, passing through Salisbury. The timetable can be downloaded from www.firstgreatwestern.co.uk.

Local Buses. There are frequent local bus services between Salisbury, Bemerton and Wilton. The R3 bus runs every 20 minutes during the day on Monday to Saturday, and hourly after about 6 pm until about 11 pm and on Sunday. This service does not pass through Lower Bemerton; the nearest stop is on the Wilton road about 250 yards from St. Andrew's church. The R8 bus runs hourly until about 6 pm from Monday to Saturday and there is a stop in Lower Bemerton. Both services run past Salisbury station. Timetables can be found online at www.salisburyreds.co.uk/route-list.shtml. Allow 30 minutes to travel between Wilton and Salisbury.

Car Parking. Parking in Salisbury Cathedral Close and Sarum College is very limited. There are both long and short stay car parks in Salisbury city centre. Parking is easier in the evening, and is free. During the day, visitors are recommended to use one of the five Park & Ride sites; buses to and from the city centre run every 15 minutes until 6pm. Details are online at www.wiltshire.gov.uk/parkingtransportandstreets/carparking/parkandride.htm. Parking is generally easier in Bemerton and Wilton. Some of the Poetry Discussion Group venues have off-road parking available.

ACCOMMODATION

The full range of visitor accommodation in Salisbury, from B&B to four star hotels, can be found at www.visitwiltshire.co.uk. The website also lists the limited but good standard accommodation available in Wilton, Bemerton and Quidhampton.
