Affordable Learning

The course programme includes both online and onsite courses, as noted. Most day courses (normally 10am to 4pm) are £70 for the standard rate.

A 20% discount on course fees (up to £100) is available to those who:

- are studying or have studied on one of Sarum College's postgraduate courses validated by the University of Winchester;
- are training or have trained for ministry at Sarum College or previous organisations at 19 The Close, Salisbury;
- are aged 25 or under, are on low incomes or receive government benefits.

A day course with ensuite B&B at the educational rate is £140.



Take your learning further

Postgraduate Study in Theology, Ministry and Mission

We welcome independent students to study on flexible pathways with options to tailor the course to your own learning and formational needs.

All students study advanced skills in theological reflection and research methods. Other module options include modern theology, advanced biblical studies, mission and ecclesiology, worship and liturgy, an extended placement, leadership and an independent learning project.

Programmes offer scope to develop areas of interest within and between modules. MA students can cultivate a specialism and develop independent research skills through the dissertation. Validated by Durham University through its Common Awards Programme.

Postgraduate Study in Christian Spirituality

Students learn collaboratively in a modular curriculum arranged around four-day residential teaching intensives throughout the year.

Consolidating our class-based teaching in this way widens access to working students and allows the College to recruit world-leading scholars and seasoned practitioners to lecture on modules. Postgraduate course modules are open to all so you may enrol on any MA module as an "auditor" without registering for an accredited programme such as the full MA.

An auditor participates in a module in exactly the same way as enrolled students but there is no requirement to prepare an assessment, nor any academic credit for participating in this way.

There is also an option to choose to participate in a module as an assessed auditor for those who would like to add discipline and tutor feedback to their study but aren't sure about taking on a full degree programme.


