Sarum Course in Spiritual Direction


This programme aims to equip those who are called to the ministry of Spiritual Direction to confidently and competently accompany others. The course is delivered in several formats: residential, online, and mixed mode, to accommodate access requirements and learning preferences.

The next three cohorts begin in October 2026 (mixed mode), September 2027 (online), and September 2027 (residential). All courses include taught sessions with expert tutors, small group work, practice in Spiritual Direction, reflective activities and feedback. 
